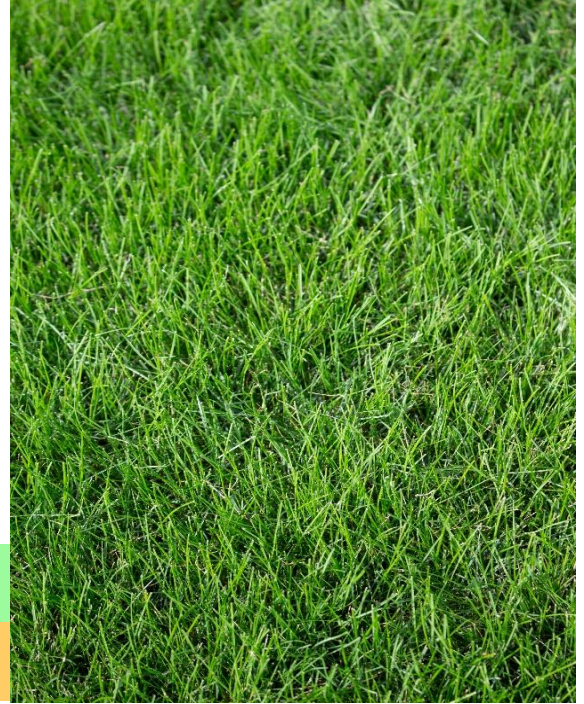

## SW CYGNUS

<b>Species</b>	Chewing's fescue
<b>Botanical name</b>	Festuca rubra commutata
<b>Seeding rate</b>	25 g/m <sup>2</sup>
<b>Distance between rows</b>	Broadcast seeding
<b>Sowing period</b>	March to September
<b>Sowing depth</b>	Superficial

### Variety description

SW CYGNUS is a variety of Chewing's fescue that is particularly well-suited for recreational and ornamental lawns. This variety stands out for its very fine leaves and a low susceptibility to disease. In addition to the above beneficial characteristics, SW CYGNUS also exhibits a very high competitive vigour against weeds, which allows for effective lawn establishment.
