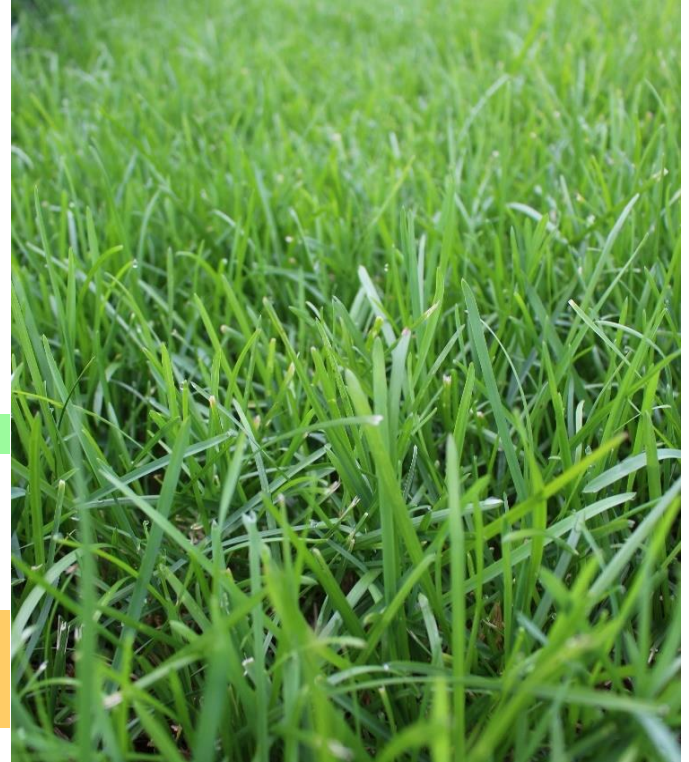

Variety description

LIMAGIE is a well-established smooth-stalked meadow grass variety with good agronomic performance. Its distinguishing features include high yields and good resistance against rust. High sward density combined with good ability to regrow throughout the year make LIMAGIE a key component in many grassland mixtures.

Most important characteristics

High-yielding
Good persistence
Low susceptibility to rust
High ability for regrowth

Usage

Smooth-stalked meadow grass forms underground runners which help create an extremely dense sward. It can also tolerate trampling very well. This bottom grass, with productivity value 8, is also very winter-hardy and extremely persistent. It is particularly suitable for dry locations with intensive cropping, which for instance is essential on grasslands that are either grazed or mowed.
