Variety description

LOPALY is a new French cultivar with outstanding agronomic performance. LOPALY was approved in Germany for the first time in 2024 and currently boasts the highest trial results of any alfalfa variety in Germany. Its impressive characteristics include especially high green and dry matter yields alongside very high protein content. With excellent stability and very high resistance to lucerne wilt and Sclerotinia trifoliorum (clover rot), LOPALY is in a class of its own. LOPALY's deep and wide-reaching root network provides powerful drought resistance. At the same time, it has the highest persistence rating of any variety for which trial data is available.
